In order to seal your criminal records, you must meet certain requirements. First, you must wait a number of years after your release, if you were in jail. The clock begins when you complete parole or probation. If you were acquitted or had charges dismissed you can seal those records right away. However, if you have gotten into trouble again since your original charges, you may not be able to get your records sealed immediately. **CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN, FELONY DUIs, and SEXUAL OFFENSES can never be sealed. In addition, if you were dishonorably discharged from probation on a case, that charge is not eligible for record sealing.**

Category A or B felony	15 years
Category C or D felony	12 years
Category E felony	7 years
Non-felony DUI	7 years
Non-felony battery domestic violence	7 years
Enhanceable misdemeanors	7 years
Gross misdemeanors	5 years
All other misdemeanors	2 years
Acquitted/Dismissed charges or Honorable Discharge on charge under NRS 453.3363	No wait

### **DIRECTIONS**

The Clark County Law Library is located in downtown Las Vegas, between Bridger Ave. and Lewis Ave. It is on the east side of Third Street. **Please allow additional time to find parking.**

From I-15, take the East Charleston exit. Travel east on Charleston, turn left (north) on 4th Street, turn left on Lewis, turn right on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. Destination is on your right.

From I-95, take the So. Las Vegas Blvd. exit. Travel south on Las Vegas Blvd., turn right on Bridger Ave., turn left on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. Destination is on your left.
